
TEN WAYS to GETthe MOST from your Writing Center



Schedule early. Once the semester hits full swing, our schedule is often booked solid 3-4 days out. Make an appointment up to a week in advance to find a time that works with your schedule.



Register with WCOnline. Save time by registering on our system to book appointments. Students can learn more about registering for our system in the Appointments section of our website.



Check all 3 schedules. Since East campus is always the fullest schedule, make sure to switch locations in the drop-down menu at the top of the schedule to check for available slots online (for graduate and commuter students only) and on West campus.



Choose a coach that's right for you. We have over 25 coaches who come from different academic backgrounds. Read bios by clicking on an appointment slot in WCOnline to find a coach who fits best.



Expect to become a better writer. Our coaches encourage students to engage with their own writing process, thus helping improve their writing skills for the long haul instead of just fixing "mistakes."
